The complete statement of Josephus includes Achencherres (III) as 13th king for 12 years 3 months. There is no monumental place for this name. Petrie considers that the entry is a duplication due to Acherres and Ackerres occurring already as 12 years 1 month and 12 years 5 months, respectively.

Inscriptions at the Temple of Serabit in Sinai confirm that Hatshepsut was co-regent with Tahutmes III during the first 22 years of the latter's reign. Apart from this, other evidence determines that the 16th year of Hatshepsut was the 3rd year of Tahutems III.

Petrie explains that 36 years for Amenhotep III, as against 30 years 10 months from Josephus, is due to co-regency.

Petrie explains that 36 years 5 months in Josephus for Amenhotep IV is the duration of the Aten worship founded by that king.

Petrie explains that the 21 years of Hor-em-heb are dated from his first year of generalship (semi-independent), but, nevertheless 17 years prior to his actually becoming king.
